Job Title: Camp Counselor

Pay Rate: \$700 up to per week

Hours per Week: Approximately 40

Season: June – the beginning of August (6 or 8 weeks)

Job Summary

Under the supervision of the On-Site Director, the Camp Counselor is responsible for the daily supervision, safety, and engagement of camp participants. Counselors prepare, conduct, and lead camp activities while creating a fun, positive, and inclusive camp environment. This position requires participation in weekly staff meetings, staff training sessions, and occasional overnight or late-night activities.

Key Responsibilities

- Supervise and monitor campers to ensure a safe and positive camp experience
 - Plan, prepare, and lead daily camp activities
 - Promote a fun, inclusive, and respectful environment for all campers
 - Assist with setup, cleanup, and organization of program areas
 - Communicate effectively with campers, staff, and supervisors
 - Attend weekly staff meetings and all required training sessions

Job Description

This role includes planning engaging activities, supervising campers, and creating a fun, safe, and positive environment for all participants.

JOB DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES

- Develop, plan, and implement a specialty program (Crafts, Sports, Performing Arts, Cooking, or Science).
 - Supervise and engage camp participants during specialty activities and general camp times.
 - Provide a safe, supportive, and positive environment for all campers.
 - Adapt activities to meet the needs and abilities of various age groups.
 - Maintain program supplies, equipment, and activity spaces.
 - Communicate effectively with the Director, staff, and campers.
 - Make independent decisions when necessary and respond appropriately to emergencies or behavioral issues.
 - Attend required training sessions (dates TBA) prior to the start of camp.
 - Be available Monday through Friday from June through mid-August.

Staff members in this role must attend weekly staff meetings, participate in training sessions, and be reliable and enthusiastic team players.

Key Responsibilities

- Supervise campers during extended day/after-care program hours
 - Prepare, lead, and monitor age-appropriate activities

 - Assist with daily setup, cleanup, and organization of activity spaces
 - Communicate effectively with parents, staff, and the On-Site Director
 - Attend weekly staff meetings and mandatory training sessions
